Scholarships specifically for Colorado Students

Daniel's Fund Scholarship--Deadline: October 15

- Be a high school senior graduating from a school in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
- Earn a minimum Grade Point Average of 3.0 in high school (on an unweighted 4.0 scale)
- Earn a minimum SAT Math score of 490 and a minimum Evidence-Based Reading & Writing score of 490, or a minimum ACT score of 18 in each category (writing score not required). Super scoring is not accepted.
- Meet financial eligibility requirements as described.

Coca-Cola Scholarship—Deadline: October 31

- Current high school (or home-schooled) student attending a school in the U.S. (or select DoD schools) who will graduate during the 2022-2023 academic school year
- U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent Residents, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees - based on the guidelines utilized by U.S. Department of Education for Federal Financial Aid eligibility
- Expecting to receive high school diploma during current academic year
- Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution
- Able to verify a minimum overall B/3.0 GPA in high school coursework

Lockheed Martin STEM Scholarship-Deadline: April 1, 2024

Lockheed Martin launched the STEM Scholarship Program in 2018 as part of investment in the next generation of STEM talent. We are committed to providing access to pathways through education and into the STEM workforce for all students, particularly those from diverse backgrounds and communities historically underrepresented in STEM fields.

Each year, the STEM Scholarship Program awards \$10,000 to 200 recipients studying engineering or computer science at a 4-year college or university. Recipients may renew the scholarship up to three times for a total potential value of \$40,000 per student.

Applications for the new cycle will open in January 2023.

Applicants to the Lockheed Martin STEM Scholarship Program must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- Demonstrated financial need
- High school senior with a 2.5 or above GPA OR a freshman or a sophomore undergraduate student with a 2.5 or above GPA
- Current or planned 4-year degree enrollment in the following majors:
 - Aerospace Engineering
 - Computer Engineering
 - Computer Science
 - Electrical Engineering
 - Electrical and Computer Engineering
 - Industrial Engineering
 - o Mathematics
 - Mechanical Engineering
 - Physics
- Current or planned full-time attendance at an accredited U.S. four-year college or university
- Interest in a paid internship with Lockheed Martin following their freshman, sophomore or junior year of college, other circumstances notwithstanding (note: the internship is not required to receive a scholarship, and scholarship recipients are not guaranteed an internship)

Boettcher Scholarship—Deadline: November 1

- Be a graduating Colorado high school senior who has lived in Colorado for your full junior and senior years of high school;
- Apply during the fall of what is your final year of high school (the equivalent of your senior year), even if you are graduating early or considering taking a gap year after graduation;
- Graduate from a Colorado high school; and
- Be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or lawfully present (including through Deferred Action for

Childhood Arrivals (DACA)) in the United States OR Meet the requirements and have applied or started the process of applying for citizenship, legal status or lawful presence. (Although students can be in the application process for citizenship, legal status, or lawful presence during the Boettcher selection timeframe, in order to become a Boettcher Scholar, you must provide documentation that shows you have successfully completed the process.)

Denver Foundation Scholarship (Various deadlines. Many are early March)

Students can search for a variety of scholarship opportunities below. Each scholarship fund has different goals and supports different paths for different people.

Rocky Mountain Association for College Admission Counseling (RMACAC) Student Scholarship— Deadline: March 15, 2024

- RMACAC awards fifteen \$1,000 scholarships to three students from each state in RMACAC's region: Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.
- In order to qualify, a student must reside in or attend school in one of our five region states, is in their final year of high school (or attend a regionally accredited 2-year college), and be attending (or transferring to) a regionally accredited college or university beginning Summer 2024 or Fall 2024. Qualifying students must also have a 3.0 high school (or college for transfer students) GPA on a 4.0 scale. International students and students with undocumented/DACA status who attend high school or a 2-year college within the RMACAC region are also eligible to apply.
- Students wishing to apply for this scholarship should submit the scholarship application and have a high school counselor (who is a RMACAC member) complete the counselor recommendation form. A RMACAC member may recommend up to two students. Applications and counselor recommendations are due **March 15, 2024 at 5p**.

The Kit Faragher Foundation Scholarship—Deadline April 19, 2024

- The Kit Faragher Foundation is pleased to continue the Kit Faragher Memorial Scholarship for the 2024-2025 school year! Three scholarships will be awarded to support graduating Colorado high school students: two of those will go to students from anywhere in Colorado and one is specifically designated for a graduating senior from Montrose County. The recipients will receive \$10,000 each, distributed over the first two years of their college, university, or technical school program.
- These scholarships will support high school seniors who have earned cumulative 2.5 GPAs, are in strong need of financial assistance for college, university, or technical school, and who demonstrate positive attitudes, strong commitments, and drives toward accomplishment.
