Scholarships for Colorado Students

[Daniel's Fund Scholarship: October 15](#)

- Be a **high school senior** graduating from a school in Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a resident of Colorado, New Mexico, Utah, or Wyoming
- Be a citizen or permanent resident of the United States
- Earn a minimum **Grade Point Average of 3.0 in high school** (on an unweighted 4.0 scale)
- Earn a minimum **SAT Math score of 490 and a minimum Evidence-Based Reading & Writing score of 490**, or a minimum **ACT score of 18** in each category (writing score not required). Super scoring is not accepted.
- Meet financial eligibility requirements as described.

[Coca-Cola Scholarship: October 31](#)

- Current high school (or home-schooled) student attending a school **in the U.S.** (or select DoD schools) who will graduate during the 2022-2023 academic school year
- U.S. Citizens, U.S. Nationals, U.S. Permanent Residents, Refugees, Asylees, Cuban-Haitian Entrants, or Humanitarian Parolees - based on the guidelines utilized by U.S. Department of Education for Federal Financial Aid eligibility
- Expecting to receive high school diploma during current academic year
- Planning to pursue a degree at an accredited U.S. post-secondary institution

- Able to verify a minimum overall B/3.0 GPA in high school coursework

[Lockheed Martin STEM Scholarship](#)-January

Lockheed Martin launched the STEM Scholarship Program in 2018 as part of investment in the next generation of STEM talent. We are committed to providing access to pathways through education and into the STEM workforce for all students, particularly those from diverse backgrounds and communities historically underrepresented in STEM fields.

Each year, the STEM Scholarship Program awards \$10,000 to 200 recipients studying engineering or computer science at a 4-year college or university. Recipients may renew the scholarship up to three times for a total potential value of \$40,000 per student.

Applications for the new cycle will open in January 2023.

Applicants to the Lockheed Martin STEM Scholarship Program must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- U.S. citizen
- Demonstrated financial need
- High school senior with a 2.5 or above GPA OR a freshman or a sophomore undergraduate student with a 2.5 or above GPA
- Current or planned 4-year degree enrollment in the following majors:
 - Aerospace Engineering
 - Computer Engineering
 - Computer Science
 - Electrical Engineering
 - Electrical and Computer Engineering
 - Industrial Engineering
 - Mathematics
 - Mechanical Engineering
 - Physics
- Current or planned full-time attendance at an accredited U.S. four-year college or university
- Interest in a paid internship with Lockheed Martin following their freshman, sophomore or junior year of college, other circumstances notwithstanding (note: the internship is not required to receive a scholarship, and scholarship recipients are not guaranteed an internship)

[Boettcher Scholarship: November 1](#)

- Be a graduating Colorado high school senior who has lived in Colorado for your full junior and senior years of high school;
- Apply during the fall of what is your final year of high school (the equivalent of your senior year), even if you are graduating early or considering taking a gap year after

graduation;

- Graduate from a Colorado high school; and
- Be a citizen, legal permanent resident, or lawfully present (including through Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)) in the United States OR Meet the requirements and have applied or started the process of applying for citizenship, legal status or lawful presence. (Although students can be in the application process for citizenship, legal status, or lawful presence during the Boettcher selection timeframe, in order to become a Boettcher Scholar, you must provide documentation that shows you have successfully completed the process.)
